8. What are the strengths of the course?

- Dr. Low established a strong foundation for understanding biblical texts, and placed special emphasis on contextualizing them in relation to the the time, place, and authors/motives of their origin (an extremely important first step for students being introduced to religious texts, particularly ones as contested as those of the Bible). She also emphasized the importance of careful and correct citation and of critically engaging with translated material. Assignments were extremely accessible and enjoyable. I could tell they were carefully designed to provide engagement with key ideas in the text and in religious scholarship, without overburdening or intimidating students who are new to the field. In particular I enjoyed the Text Note Shout-outs, which encourage students to do the reading while offering the student a chance to engage with something they personally found most interesting (or puzzling). I felt these were an excellent way to maintain student interaction and give them room to explore the many intriccies of the text for themselves. The selected readings covered a broad range throughout the Old Testament without proving too lengthy to keep up with, and they gave me a much better sense of biblical chronology than I had before. Again, the contextualization with historical events of the times was very helpful (both for the events the books purport to deal with, and for when the books are estimated to have actually been written as the two are not always the same). As a final note, I felt that the New Oxford Annotated Bible was an extremely good selection. The annotations provide many interesting and relevant details, and the many short introductions and articles are well-written, succinct, and useful. I only wish that the text were a bit bigger, but that is not under Dr. Low's purview!
